BUDGET & TAXES

As Councilman, consistently votes for fiscal responsibility and against tax increases.

Cast the deciding "NO" vote to defeat Mayor Hahn's sales-tax increase proposal (2/05)

Endorsed by the Howard Jarvis Taxpayer Association

Pledges to veto all D.W.P. rate increases as Mayor.

Leading proponent and strongest advocate to raise L.A.'s sales tax

After four years under James Hahn, over 125,000 Angelenos are unemployed, and the city's unemployment rate is significantly higher than the rest of Los Angeles County (Source: State of California Employment Development Department)

As Speaker of Assembly, passed budgets resulting in state's \$38 billion deficit and a bill that raised our sales tax (2002)

Chairman of local ballot measure to raise sales tax (2004)

Received failing marks from the California Chamber of Commerce for his anti-job, pro-tax voting record (Source: Chamber of Commerce "ALERT")

Advocated energy-rate increase to bailout Edison during energy crisis (Source: L.A. Times)

CRIME

During his five-year tenure as Chief of Police, violent crime dropped more than 30% (Source: F.B.I.)

Broke 2001 campaign promise to hire 1,000 new police officers; L.A. remains the "most underpoliced big city in America"

Voted to gut "3-Strikes" law and give thousands of convicted felons, including murderers and rapists, early release from prison (SB 2048).

INTEGRITY & ETHICS

The Daily News opined that Bernard Parks offers voters "a record of integrity"

Chief Parks faithfully served in the LAPD for 38 years, 4 of them as Chief.

The Chief instituted a rigorous ethical atmosphere within the police force to root out corruption and discipline our force

Criminal probes are investigating Hahn's administration on corruption charges and several of his appointees have resigned amid scandal allegations.
