Cameron Smyth was elected to the Santa Clarita City Council in 2000 and reelected in 2004. He served as mayor in 2003 and again in 2005.

Born and raised in Newhall, Cameron attended local public schools and received his bachelor's degree from the University of California, Davis.

In 1994, he began serving on the staff of former state legislator Pete Knight. After managing Knight's successful state Senate campaign in 1996, Cameron became Senator Knight's deputy chief of staff.

In 2000, he moved to the private sector, working in public relations. He currently operates his own consulting business.

Cameron has served on the board of several nonprofit organizations, including the American Diabetes Association, the American Cancer Society, the Special Olympics, the Betty Ferguson Foundation and the Santa Clarita Youth Project.

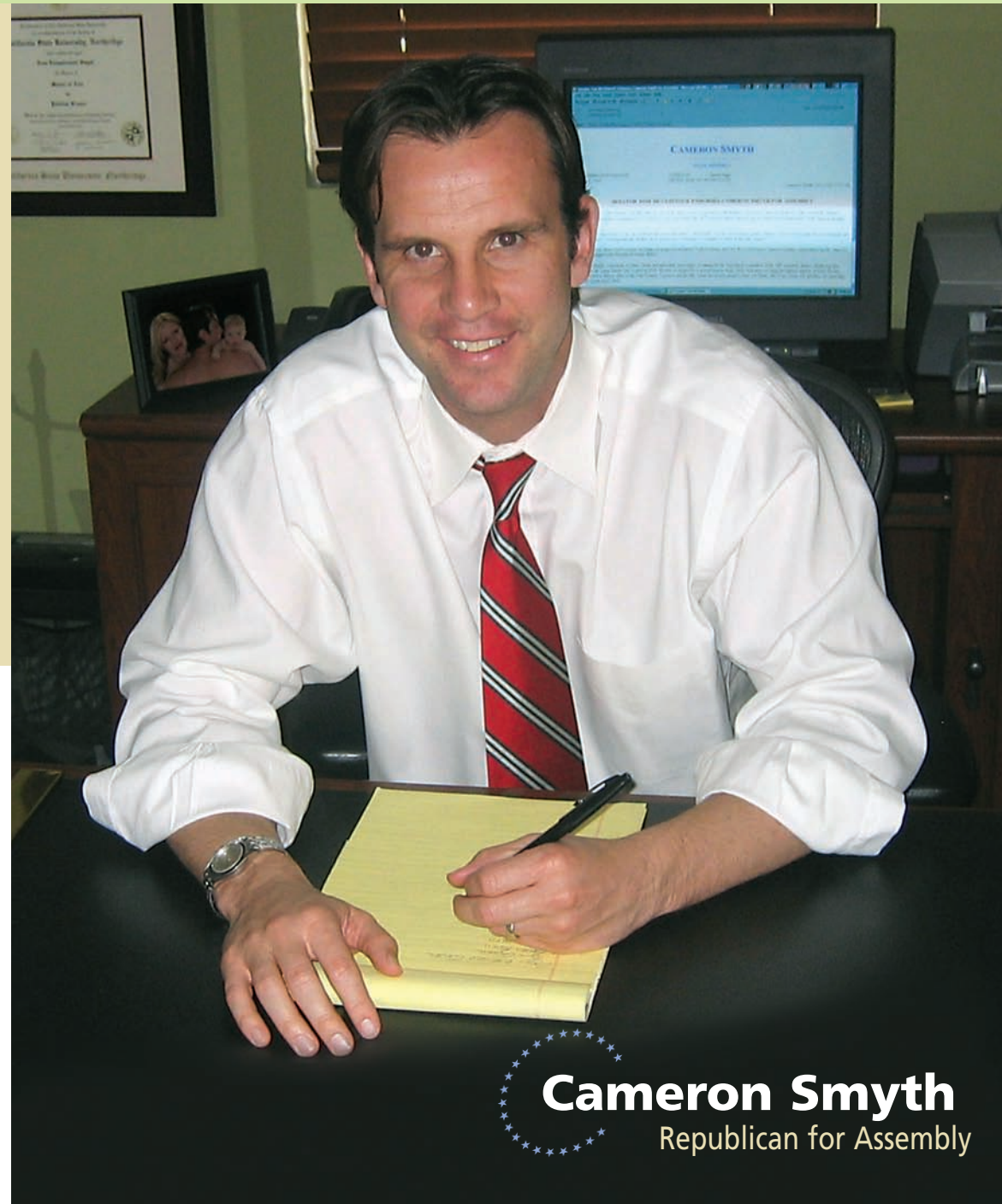

ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION: REMOVE INCENTIVES FOR ENTERING THE U.S. ILLEGALLY

The Federation for American Immigration Reform estimates illegal immigration presently costs California taxpayers at least \$12 billion annually. With over 12 million illegal immigrants now living in the U.S., and more arriving every day, the cost will only rise.

While politicians squabbled, Councilman Cameron Smyth and his colleagues took action by passing a local law requiring companies doing business with the City of Santa Clarita to verify they do not hire illegal immigrants.

REDUCE TRAFFIC CONGESTION NOW

NEIGHBORHOOD CONTROL OF OUR PUBLIC SCHOOLS

In Santa Clarita and Simi Valley, public schools have done well in preparing the next generation. In the San Fernando Valley, however, schools have simply not performed to acceptable standards.



Why is this? While we have many good teachers and bright students in the Valley, our public schools are controlled by the mammoth Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) and its downtown L.A. bureaucrats.

Cameron will continue the fight to break up the LAUSD and create smaller school districts with local neighborhood control.
